Last week I attended further training as part of the Leading cultures of Teaching Excellence (LcoTE). This is a three-year commitment for our school to support quality teaching and leadership which are part of our 2024 – 2027 Business Plan. This is supporting the implementation of a shared Reading model across the school.

NAPLAN results have been shared with our Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 families this week. For the majority of results student achievement has show improvement when compared with expected performance. It is very exciting to see that for our Year 3, 5, and 7 students they are performing above Like Schools in 10 out of 12 NAPLAN assessments. This will be a discussion for the School Council meeting.

A thank you to Mrs Cassie Badcock for her ongoing effort to ensure that our school environment is a safe. During the holidays the decking near the secondary rooms was replaced and giving this part of our school a refresh.

I appreciate the positive response to the class restructure that occurred at the beginning of this term. Whilst any change has the potential to be disruptive it appears that the shift has been smooth with teachers supporting students as they adjust to their new setting. Mathematics – Number Talks

At Onslow School, Number Talks are a teaching strategy to help students develop their mental math skills and enhance their number sense.

What are Number Talks?

Number Talks help to build fluency with the mental

calculations using short exercises aimed at building students' ability to manipulate numbers to help with solving number problems without using paper and pencil. The focus is on discussing different strategies to solve the problem and understanding the underlying concepts, rather than just finding the correct answer.

Parents can support Number Talks at home by encouraging mental math, discussing strategies used in games, playing math games using <u>cards</u>, and celebrating different ways of thinking and asking questions like "How did you get that answer?" or "Can you think of another way to solve it?"

During our Open Classroom parents will have the opportunity to see a Number Talk in action after the assembly in Week 5.


